
3. Immersion Hypothermia

- 2. Gradual drop in body core temperature
- 3. Wearing a life jacket may increase survival time







THINK ABOUT IT- IF YOU'RE WEARING A LIFE JACKET, YOU DON'T HAVE TO WORRY ABOUT DROWNING DURING THE GASP REFLEX AND YOU ARE ABLE TO KEEP YOUR HEAD ABOVE WATER WHEN YOUR ARMS AND LEGS GET SO COLD YOU CAN'T USE THEM!

> WEARING A LIFE JACKET DRASTICALLY INCREASES YOUR SURVIVAL TIME! THIS GIVES RESCUERS MORE TIME TO RESCUE YOU, OR MORE TIME FOR YOU TO RESCUE YOURSELF.






